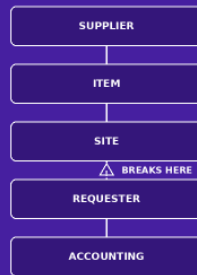




Why Bad Master Data Breaks PO Automation

Master Data Is Operational Control, Not an IT Task

A workflow can only be as reliable as the data behind it. One weak link in supplier, item or accounting data breaks the chain.



Why Bad Master Data Breaks Purchase Order Automation

Purchase order automation promises speed, control and better spend visibility. But automation cannot compensate for weak master data.

When supplier, item, category, site, requester or accounting information is incomplete, inconsistent or poorly governed, the effects are felt immediately in procurement operations. Requisitions require manual correction. POs are routed incorrectly. Invoices fail to match. Approvals are delayed. Finance teams lose confidence in the process and revert to workarounds.

The problem is often misdiagnosed as a workflow issue.

In reality, a workflow can only make decisions based on the information available to it. If a supplier is duplicated, an item is poorly classified or accounting defaults are unreliable, an automated process will either stop, create exceptions or push bad data further downstream.

For Oracle ERP organisations, master data is not simply an IT concern. It is a core component of operational control.

Good data enables procurement teams to create the right PO, apply the right buying policy, select the appropriate supplier and direct spend to the correct cost centre or project. It also provides the foundation for effective matching when the invoice arrives.

That is why Sarrisco approaches **PO and AP automation** as connected processes. A purchase order should not be viewed as a document created in isolation. It is the commercial and operational record that enables downstream receiving, invoice matching, accounting and payment. The quality of the original PO data has a direct effect on the efficiency of AP.

The practical answer is not a major data-cleanse programme before every improvement initiative. It is to establish the controls that prevent bad data from entering or being used in critical processes, while progressively addressing the data issues that create the most operational friction.

This may include validation at point of entry, clearer ownership of supplier and item data, standardised coding, defined rules for non-catalogue purchasing and dashboards that expose recurring data-quality failures.

The organisations that get the greatest value from automation do not treat data, procurement and finance as separate workstreams. They design the process end to end.

Better master data does not just make automation possible.

It makes spend more visible, POs more reliable and Oracle ERP more valuable to the business.
